2:30 1 Peter 3:1-7 Reading, Teaching. ...Wives in the same way.... A reference to the tone of respect that Peter illuminated in the previous chapter on authority. Reference 1 Peter 2:13 "...submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every authority..."

Teaching on the concept that God has established a pattern of functional order for: 1. The State, 2. The Church, 3. The Family.

7:00 1 Peter 2:13-17 Teaching on the correct response to the presence of authority. The human condition is often contrary to the idea of submission. Teaching on the origin of rebellion against authority.

Mankind is created in the image of God: 1. Capable of entering into a relationship with God himself. 2. Man is given the ability of choice – Free Will.

10:45 Teaching on man exercising his free will to reject the authority of God. Reference Genesis 2 and 3 where Adam and Eve violated God's command. Sin – using our will contrary to the will of God. The essence of the human problem is that we set ourselves up as the king of our little kingdom.

God's purpose remains the same as always: to bring into existence a people who will choose to live under his authority. Reference Revelation 3:20.

22:00 1 Peter 2:13-15 "Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every authority instituted among men: whether to the king, as the supreme authority, 14 or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right."

There is a place for standing up to the misuse of authority.

Teaching. Reference Galatians 3:28 No distinction male and female. There is of course a difference, but no distinction is based on the difference.

- 35:15 Ephesians 5:22-32 "Wives, submit to your husbands as to the Lord. 23 For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. 24 Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything." Teaching and reading of 5:22-33.
- 38:05 Ephesians 5:21 "Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ" Teaching.
- 41:30 Terry opens the teaching to questions and answers. Many of the questions are difficult to hear but the answers usually give a sense of the issue.
- 1:00:30 Teaching continues after the question and answer interlude.

We should submit to one another as for the Lord's sake. Reference 1 Peter 2:13. Further the model for the husband is to be as sacrificial as Christ's relationship to the church.

The relationship a Christian has to the Lord in terms of submission, will determine their respect for authority in the marriage. Submission vertically makes submission horizontally easier.
