:00-2:30 Comments on Peter's intentions in writing the epistle.

2:30 1 Peter 5:7 "Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you." Teaching.

4:25 1 Peter 5:8-9 Be self-controlled and alert. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. <u>9</u> Resist him, standing firm in the faith, because you know that your brothers throughout the world are undergoing the same kind of sufferings.

Teaching. There has been an enemy in our midst. Reference Genesis 3. It is rebelliousness. It is within all of us, but was personified in Satan. Satan is not eternal, nor of equal power with God – he only exists through the permissive will of God and was created as an angel.

8:15 Job Terry gives a paraphrased synopsis of Satan's dialogue with God over what to do with Job, and the activities which followed. Job is synonymous with difficulties, trouble and suffering – but at no time did Satan have unpermitted authority over him. Satan is currently under restraint, but will there come a time when he will have the restraint lifted.

12:35 1 John 5:18-21 The whole world is under the control of the evil one. Our protection is in the Lord – do we know how to appropriate the protective covering of God? We are in a world of tension and we need to be active.

14:55 John 17:4 Jesus accomplished all the Father gave him. Reference John 19:30 "It is finished".

15:24 1 John 3:8 ..the reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works of the devil. Question: Did Jesus succeed or fail? Hebrews 2:14-15 Jesus' death destroyed the Devil's work and the fear of death. Victory over Satan, Sin and Death.

17:20 1 Peter 5:8 ...be self-controlled and alert... Teaching. Reference Matthew 26:36-46 Staying alert – awake. Be aware of what is going on and the dangers around.

21:30 1 Peter 5:8 ...your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Reference Psalm 22:13 Roaring lions.

...resist him , standing firm in the faith, because you know that your brothers throughout the world are undergoing the same kind of sufferings. Reference James 4:7 Resist the devil and he will flee from you.

Christians need to know what they believe and stand in it. Teaching on the current cultural attitude toward certitude, especially in academia.
