04-036-55 HEARD, SEEN, TOUCHED, PROCLAIMED

1:20 Reference to Deuteronomy 8:3; Matthew 4:4; Luke 4:4. Man does not live by bread alone but by every word from the mouth of God.

1:30 Reference to Psalm 119:105. The word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path.

Hebrews 4:12 The word is as a sharp double-edged sword which is able to penetrate and divide soul, and spirit so that a man can see his thoughts and motives for what they really are.

Ephesians 6:10-18. The armor of God, with focus on the sword of the Spirit.

2:35 2 Timothy 3:16-17. The scripture is the equipment of the Christian.

3:15 Reading of 1 John 1:1-4

4:20 John 1:1; Genesis 1:1 and 1Jn 1:1 all have the same basic wording which focuses on "The Beginning".

7:30 John 1:14 The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us and we have beheld His Glory.

9:15 1 John 1:1-4 The similarity to the truth expressed in John 1. John makes clear that he has personally seen, heard, and touched God incarnate. A reference to Docetism and the nature of heresies within Christian thinking over time.

19:15 1 John 4:1-3 Jesus has come in the flesh.

21:50 Teaching continues back at 1 John 1:1-4.

23:00 Reference to the Transfiguration: Matt 17:1-8; Mark 9:2-8; Luke 9:28-36; 2 Peter 1:16-18.

26:00 Ephesians 1:17-18 The eyes of the heart enlightened to see the Spiritual truth.

Return to 1 John 1:1-4

29:25 Jesus connected the concepts of Loving God (Vertical) and Loving neighbor (Horizontal). Matthew 22:37-39; Mark 12:29-31; Luke 10:27.

31:00 1 John 1:1 "The Word of life". Acts 4:31 "The word of God". Acts 6:2 "The word of God". Christians are not to proclaim man-made messages but truth of the word of God.

33:20 2 Corinthians 1:18-20 The message of God is not left to ambiguity, either yes or no. The word is Yes.

36:30 Acts 8:25 ".....spoken the word of the Lord.....", Then reference to 1 Corinthians 12:3; and John 16:13-14. Hebrews 4:2 ...the message they heard.. A teaching on those who have the willingness to speak the word of God and those who are willing to receive it.

42:30 1 Corinthians 1:21-25. Understanding and receiving the truth of God is not left to human intellection. Romans 10:13-17. Matthew 13:19 – "the word of the Kingdom". Colossians 1:5 ...the word of Truth...

Mark 9:2 And after six days Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves; and he was transfigured before them, 3 and his garments became glistening, intensely white, as no fuller on earth could bleach them. 4 And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses; and they were talking to Jesus. 5 And Peter said to Jesus, “Master, it is well that we are here; let us make three booths, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah.” 6 For he did not know what to say, for they were exceedingly afraid. 7 And a cloud overshadowed them, and a voice came out of the cloud, “This is my beloved Son; listen to him.” 8 And suddenly looking around they no longer saw any one with them but Jesus only.

Luke 9:28 Now about eight days after these sayings he took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. 29 And as he was praying, the appearance of his countenance was altered, and his raiment became dazzling white. 30 And behold, two men talked with him, Moses and Elijah, 31 who appeared in glory and spoke of his departure, which he was to accomplish at Jerusalem. 32 Now Peter and those who were with him were heavy with sleep, and when they wakened they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. 33 And as the men were parting from him, Peter said to Jesus, “Master, it is well that we are here; let us make three booths, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah” — not knowing what he said. 34 As he said this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. 35 And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, “This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!” 36 And when the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silence and told no one in those days anything of what they had seen.

2Pet. 1:16 For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty. 17 For when he received honor and glory from God the Father and the voice was borne to him by the Majestic Glory, “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased,” 18 we heard this voice borne

from heaven, for we were with him on the holy mountain.

Eph. 1:17 that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, 18 having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints,

1Cor. 12:3 Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says “Jesus be cursed!” and no one can say “Jesus is Lord” except by the Holy Spirit.

John 16:13 When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. 14 He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you.

Heb. 4:2 For good news came to us just as to them; but the message which they heard did not benefit them, because it did not meet with faith in the hearers.
