## # 07-056-56 AN ANGEL AND A SMALL SCROLL

- :00 The recording opens with a reading of the  $10^{\rm th}$  Chapter of Revelation.
  - 2:00 Terry gives a synopsis of the chapters before.
  - 17:40 Teaching on the 10<sup>th</sup> chapter begins.
- 20:20 2 Corinthians 12:1-4 Paul writes of an experience in some ways similar to that of John, as expressed in Revelation 10:4. There are some things that God has not told us.
- 22:45 Deuteronomy 29:29 'The secret things belong to the Lord our God, but the things revealed belong to us and to our children forever, that we may follow all the words of this law." We are given the words of scripture to help us in our obedience to the will and purpose of the Lord. Not to answer esoteric curiosities that we might have. The lesson: we should not fabricate an answer for things to which God has not spoken. This is a particular danger for some in the interpretation of the book of the Revelation.
- 25:05 Revelation 10:4 "Seven thunders" Thunder had preceded important events in the past (before the law was given at Sinai). Psalm 29 speaks of the voice of God like that of thunder.

28:20 Revelation 10:5 The angel raises his hand to heaven and swears an oath. Deuteronomy 32:40 "I lift up my hand to heaven and swear: As surely as I live forever".....

Revelation 10:6 – The declaration is "That there will be no more delay". The seventh trumpet marks the end of the Gospel age, the end of human history and the return of Christ. The resurrection of all the dead, the Judgment, and then the establishment of the eternal kingdom. (Revelation 11:15).

- 31:10 2 Peter 3:3-10 Peter describes the activity of the world preceding the Day of The Lord.
- 36:20 Revelation 10:8-11 The little scroll is the word of God. The message of salvation. Eating the word is a familiar expression in the scripture (Jeremiah 15:16; Deuteronomy 8:3; Ezekiel 2:8 3:3; Psalm 19:10 etc.). It is sweet in the mouth but bitter in the stomach sweet is the salvation message but bitter is the idea that some will reject it and judgment will come.
- 41:35 Matthew 24:7-14 The Gospel message is preached to the whole world so that all may have a chance to accept the Lord or reject him and after that the end.

Rev. 10:1 Then I saw another mighty angel coming down from heaven, wrapped in a cloud, with a rainbow over his head, and his face was like the sun, and his legs like pillars of fire. 2 He had a little scroll open in his hand. And he set his right foot on the sea, and his left foot on the land, 3 and called out with a loud voice, like a lion roaring; when he called out, the seven thunders sounded. 4 And when the seven thunders had sounded, I was about to write, but I heard a voice from heaven saying, "Seal up what the seven thunders have said, and do not write it down." 5 And the angel whom I saw standing on sea and land lifted up his right hand to heaven 6 and swore by him who lives for ever and ever, who created heaven and what is in it, the earth and what is in it, and the sea and what is in it, that there should be no more delay, 7 but that in the days of the trumpet call to be sounded by the seventh angel, the mystery of God, as he announced to his servants the prophets, should be fulfilled.

Rev. 10:8 Then the voice which I had heard from heaven spoke to me again, saying, "Go, take the scroll which is open in the hand of the angel who is standing on the sea and on the land." 9 So I went to the angel and told him to give me the little scroll; and he said to me, "Take it and eat; it will be bitter to your stomach, but sweet as honey in your mouth." 10 And I took the little scroll from the hand of the angel and ate it; it was sweet as honey in my mouth, but when I had eaten it my stomach was made bitter. 11 And I was told, "You must again prophesy about many peoples and nations and tongues and kings."

<u>2Cor. 12:1</u> I must boast; there is nothing to be gained by it, but I will go on to visions and revelations of the Lord. <u>2</u> I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven — whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows. <u>3</u> And I know that this man was caught up into Paradise — whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows — <u>4</u> and he heard things that cannot be told, which man may not utter.

<u>Deut. 29:29</u> "The secret things belong to the LORD our God; but the things that are revealed belong to us and to our children for ever, that we may do all the words of this law.

<u>Psa. 29:0</u> A Psalm of David. <u>1</u> Ascribe to the LORD, O heavenly beings, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength. <u>2</u> Ascribe to the LORD the glory of his name;

worship the LORD in holy array. 3 The voice of the LORD is upon the waters; the God of glory thunders, the LORD, upon many waters. 4 The voice of the LORD is powerful, the voice of the LORD is full of majesty. 5 The voice of the LORD breaks the cedars, the LORD breaks the cedars of Lebanon. 6 He makes Lebanon to skip like a calf, and Sirion like a young wild ox. 7 The voice of the LORD flashes forth flames of fire. 8 The voice of the LORD shakes the wilderness, the LORD shakes the wilderness of Kadesh. 9 The voice of the LORD makes the oaks to whirl, and strips the forests bare; and in his temple all cry, "Glory!" 10 The LORD sits enthroned over the flood; the LORD sits enthroned as king for ever. 11 May the LORD give strength to his people! May the LORD bless his people with peace!

Deut. 32:40 For I lift up my hand to heaven, and swear, As I live for ever,

Rev. 11:15 Then the seventh angel blew his trumpet, and there were loud voices in heaven, saying, "The kingdom of the world has become the kingdom of our Lord and of his Christ, and he shall reign for ever and ever."

<u>2Pet. 3:3</u> First of all you must understand this, that scoffers will come in the last days with scoffing, following their own passions <u>4</u> and saying, "Where is the promise of his coming? For ever since the fathers fell asleep, all things have continued as they were from the beginning of creation." <u>5</u> They deliberately ignore this fact, that by the word of God heavens existed long ago, and an earth formed out of water and by means of water, <u>6</u> through which the world that then existed was deluged with water and perished. <u>7</u> But by the same word the heavens and earth that now exist have been stored up for fire, being kept until the day of judgment and destruction of ungodly men.

<u>2Pet. 3:8</u> But do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. <u>9</u> The Lord is not slow about his promise as some count slowness, but is forbearing toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. <u>10</u> But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and the works that are upon it will be burned up.

Jer. 15:16 Thy words were found, and I ate them, and thy words became to me a joy and the delight of my heart; for I am called by thy name, O LORD, God of

hosts.

- <u>Deut. 8:3</u> And he humbled you and let you hunger and fed you with manna, which you did not know, nor did your fathers know; that he might make you know that man does not live by bread alone, but that man lives by everything that proceeds out of the mouth of the LORD.
- Ezek. 2:8 "But you, son of man, hear what I say to you; be not rebellious like that rebellious house; open your mouth, and eat what I give you." 9 And when I looked, behold, a hand was stretched out to me, and, lo, a written scroll was in it; 10 and he spread it before me; and it had writing on the front and on the back, and there were written on it words of lamentation and mourning and woe.
- Ezek. 3:1 And he said to me, "Son of man, eat what is offered to you; eat this scroll, and go, speak to the house of Israel." 2 So I opened my mouth, and he gave me the scroll to eat. 3 And he said to me, "Son of man, eat this scroll that I give you and fill your stomach with it." Then I ate it; and it was in my mouth as sweet as honey.
- <u>Psa. 19:10</u> More to be desired are they than gold, even much fine gold; sweeter also than honey and drippings of the honeycomb.
- Matt. 24:7 For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and there will be famines and earthquakes in various places: 8 all this is but the beginning of the birth-pangs.
- Matt. 24:9 "Then they will deliver you up to tribulation, and put you to death; and you will be hated by all nations for my name's sake. 10 And then many will fall away, and betray one another, and hate one another. 11 And many false prophets will arise and lead many astray. 12 And because wickedness is multiplied, most men's love will grow cold. 13 But he who endures to the end will be saved. 14 And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached throughout the whole world, as a testimony to all nations; and then the end will come.
