07-110-56 ANGELS AND THE HARVEST

- :00 Review of previous material regarding the cosmic battle that has been waged since Satan was cast from heaven.
- 6:20 Revelation 14 teaching begins. The Lamb. Zion. The 144,000.
- 10:50 Teaching on the 144,000 beginning with a reference back to Revelation 7:3ff. The complete number of God's people (not 144,000 literally but a definite number). Back to Chapter 14 at 14:30 for further teaching on the Lamb etc.
 - 16:20 Revelation 14:2-5 Sound from Heaven.
- 23:50 Jeremiah 31:31-32 God declares that he is the Husband of his people. He expects them to remain faithful to him, and not be spiritual adulterers.
- 25:30 2 Corinthians 11:2 Read Passage. It correlates to Revelation 14:4 as it relates to spiritual faithfulness in marriage. We are therefore to follow the Lamb.
- 28:10 James 1:18 We are a kind of firstfuits of his creatures. Which means that we are to be an offering to the Lord.

- 29:30 Revelation 14:5-7 The first Angel. The proclamation of an eternal gospel. Glorify God, fear him (hold him in awe), and worship him.
- 31:45 Revelation 14:8 The second Angel. Announces the fall of Babylon (those of the world in opposition to Christ).
- 34:20 Revelation 14:9-11 Those who oppose God will one day taste the judgment of the almighty, in full strength, not watered down.
- 36:00 Romans 1:18 Man can accommodate and compromise with Sin, BUT God cannot. He will have to bring judgment upon those who refuse him.

Then a return to Revelation teaching.

- 39:30 Revelation 14:12-13 Even though God's people will suffer and many will die, they will be blessed.
- 41:00 Revelation 14:14-16 One like a Son of man seated on a cloud. (reference is made to Daniel 7:13 One, like a son of man coming on the Clouds).
- 43:35 Revelation 14: 17-20 The final unleashing of the Judgment. Where the winepress of Judgment pours forth with the blood of those opposed to God, as high as a horse's bridle for 184 miles. (References to Genesis 15:14-16; Isaiah 63:3-6)

- Rev. 14:1 Then I looked, and Io, on Mount Zion stood the Lamb, and with him a hundred and forty-four thousand who had his name and his Father's name written on their foreheads. 2 And I heard a voice from heaven like the sound of many waters and like the sound of loud thunder; the voice I heard was like the sound of harpers playing on their harps, 3 and they sing a new song before the throne and before the four living creatures and before the elders. No one could learn that song except the hundred and forty-four thousand who had been redeemed from the earth. 4 It is these who have not defiled themselves with women, for they are chaste; it is these who follow the Lamb wherever he goes; these have been redeemed from mankind as first fruits for God and the Lamb, 5 and in their mouth no lie was found, for they are spotless.
- Rev. 14:6 Then I saw another angel flying in midheaven, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and tongue and people; 7 and he said with a loud voice, "Fear God and give him glory, for the hour of his judgment has come; and worship him who made heaven and earth, the sea and the fountains of water."
- Rev. 14:8 Another angel, a second, followed, saying, "Fallen, fallen is Babylon the great, she who made all nations drink the wine of her impure passion."
- Rev. 14:9 And another angel, a third, followed them, saying with a loud voice, "If any one worships the beast and its image, and receives a mark on his forehead or on his hand, 10 he also shall drink the wine of God's wrath, poured unmixed into the cup of his anger, and he shall be tormented with fire and sulphur in the presence of the holy angels and in the presence of the Lamb. 11 And the smoke of their torment goes up for ever and ever; and they have no rest, day or night, these worshipers of the beast and its image, and whoever receives the mark of its name."
- Rev. 14:12 Here is a call for the endurance of the saints, those who keep the commandments of God and the faith of Jesus.
- Rev. 14:13 And I heard a voice from heaven saying, "Write this: Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord henceforth." "Blessed indeed," says the Spirit, "that they may rest from their labors, for their deeds follow them!"

Rev. 14:14 Then I looked, and Io, a white cloud, and seated on the cloud one like a son of man, with a golden crown on his head, and a sharp sickle in his hand. 15 And another angel came out of the temple, calling with a loud voice to him who sat upon the cloud, "Put in your sickle, and reap, for the hour to reap has come, for the harvest of the earth is fully ripe." 16 So he who sat upon the cloud swung his sickle on the earth, and the earth was reaped.

Rev. 14:17 And another angel came out of the temple in heaven, and he too had a sharp sickle. 18 Then another angel came out from the altar, the angel who has power over fire, and he called with a loud voice to him who had the sharp sickle, "Put in your sickle, and gather the clusters of the vine of the earth, for its grapes are ripe." 19 So the angel swung his sickle on the earth and gathered the vintage of the earth, and threw it into the great wine press of the wrath of God; 20 and the wine press was trodden outside the city, and blood flowed from the wine press, as high as a horse's bridle, for one thousand six hundred stadia.

Rev. 7:3 saying, "Do not harm the earth or the sea or the trees, till we have sealed the servants of our God upon their foreheads." 4 And I heard the number of the sealed, a hundred and forty-four thousand sealed, out of every tribe of the sons of Israel, 5 twelve thousand sealed out of the tribe of Judah, twelve thousand of the tribe of Reuben, twelve thousand of the tribe of Gad, 6 twelve thousand of the tribe of Asher, twelve thousand of the tribe of Naphtali, twelve thousand of the tribe of Manasseh, 7 twelve thousand of the tribe of Simeon, twelve thousand of the tribe of Levi, twelve thousand of the tribe of Issachar, 8 twelve thousand of the tribe of Zebulun, twelve thousand of the tribe of Joseph, twelve thousand sealed out of the tribe of Benjamin.

Jer. 31:31 "Behold, the days are coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah, 32 not like the covenant which I made with their fathers when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt, my covenant which they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD.

<u>2Cor. 11:2</u> I feel a divine jealousy for you, for I betrothed you to Christ to present you as a pure bride to her one husband.

James 1:18 Of his own will he brought us forth by the word of truth that we

should be a kind of first fruits of his creatures.

Rom. 1:18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and wickedness of men who by their wickedness suppress the truth.

<u>Dan. 7:13</u> I saw in the night visions, and behold, with the clouds of heaven there came one like a son of man, and he came to the Ancient of Days and was presented before him.

Gen. 15:14 but I will bring judgment on the nation which they serve, and afterward they shall come out with great possessions. 15 As for yourself, you shall go to your fathers in peace; you shall be buried in a good old age. 16 And they shall come back here in the fourth generation; for the iniquity of the Amorites is not yet complete."

<u>Is. 63:3</u> "I have trodden the wine press alone, and from the peoples no one was with me; I trod them in my anger and trampled them in my wrath; their lifeblood is sprinkled upon my garments, and I have stained all my raiment. <u>4</u> For the day of vengeance was in my heart, and my year of redemption has come. <u>5</u> I looked, but there was no one to help; I was appalled, but there was no one to uphold; so my own arm brought me victory, and my wrath upheld me. <u>6</u> I trod down the peoples in my anger, I made them drunk in my wrath, and I poured out their lifeblood on the earth."
