- :00-:40 Microphone pick up distant for first 40 seconds. Review of previous teachings. Mostly starting with chapter 17:1-6; 15; 18.
- 5:50 1 John 2:15 If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him.
- 7:15 Revelation 17:18 The woman is equated with the city and now in Chapter 18 the fall of Babylon is described.
 - 8:45 13:10 Revelation 18 Reading.
- 13:40 Genesis 3:1-5 Man replaces God as ruler of his life.
- 15:50 Genesis 11:1-9 Man seeks to use the gifts he received from God intellect and resources to do his own thing. God decided to thwart the plan and sent confusion into man's plans.
- 18:50 Isaiah 14:3; 12-14 The cry of an arrogant humanity. Verses 15-17 The Lord brings them to the grave. Verses 22-23; verses 26-27 The Lord thwarts this activity.
- 21:20 Isaiah 47: 5-9 Many of the images used by John in the revelation have another inclusion in scripture.

Jeremiah 50:1 Reference to Babylon - which in scripture is used to denote the city of the world as opposed to the city of God. Verse 11 A city that plunders. Verse 28 – The Lord's vengeance against Babylon. Verse 29 Summon archers and punish those in Babylon. Verse 31 The Lord is against those from Babylon. Verse 39 Babylon becomes the haunt of beasts and birds. Verse 46 The earth will tremble at the fall of Babylon. Jeremiah chapter 51:6-7 Flee from Babylon. See the references to the Golden Cup etc. Verse 25 The Lord is against Babylon. Verse 37 Babylon a heap of ruins. Verse 41 Babylon will be seized and it will be a horror to the world. Verse 53 Even though man is determined to have his own way (reaches for the sky and builds fortifications) the Lord will destroy his efforts.

27:00 Ezekiel 28:1-11 Even though it is addressed to Tyre it represents the condition of man in the same manner as Babylon. In verses 12-19 it seems to many scholars that the Lord is addressing Satan (Lucifer) himself – Read Passage.

These Old Testament references give a sense of language used to describe the Lord's activity against those who oppose him.

30:30 Revelation 18:2-8 Spoken in the prophetic aorist tense. The author speaks as if the world (Babylon) is already fallen in Judgment even though it is yet to happen. With respect to the activity of the world; although this word is ancient, it is as though it comes from today's newspaper. Reference to 1 John 2:15-17 Read.

34:45 Ephesians 1:12 Christians are to live a life that reflects praiseworthy honor for God.

- 35:40 Revelation 18:9-19 The world's reaction to the fall of their system.
- 37:10 Revelation 18:20 Teaching on the meaning of the rejoice of God's people in the midst of the collapse of the world.
 - 38:20 Psalm 13 A cry to God to come against evil.
- 39:30 Revelation 18:20 God has judged her for the way she treated you.
 - 39:45 Revelation 6:9-10 How long Lord?
- 40:25 Romans 12:19 We are not to take revenge ourselves, it is the Lord's realm to do so.
- 41:45 Revelation 18:21 Babylon (the world) will be so destroyed as to disappear forever.
- 42:45 Jeremiah 51:59-64 Read Passage. Verses 63-64 command Jeremiah to tie the scroll describing the destruction of Babylon to a stone and throw it into the Euphrates.
- 43:35 Revelation 18:22-24 The normal sounds of life and life's activities cease.
- 43:55 Revelation 19:1-6 Terry says we are done with doom and proceeds to read the first six verses of chapter 19.

1John 2:15 Do not love the world or the things in the world. If any one loves the world, love for the Father is not in him.

Rev. 17:18 And the woman that you saw is the great city which has dominion over the kings of the earth."

Rev. 18:1 After this I saw another angel coming down from heaven, having great authority; and the earth was made bright with his splendor. 2 And he called out with a mighty voice,

myrrh, frankincense, wine, oil, fine flour and wheat, cattle and sheep, horses and chariots, and slaves, that is, human souls.

- Jer. 51:6 "Flee from the midst of Babylon, let every man save his life! Be not cut off in her punishment, for this is the time of the LORD's vengeance, the requital he is rendering her. 7 Babylon was a golden cup in the LORD's hand, making all the earth drunken; the nations drank of her wine, therefore the nations went mad.
- Jer. 51:25 "Behold, I am against you, O destroying mountain, says the LORD, which destroys the whole earth; I will stretch out my hand against you, and roll you down from the crags, and make you a burnt mountain.

How long shall my enemy be exalted over me? 3 Consider and answer me, O LORD my God; lighten my eyes, lest I sleep the sleep of death; 4 lest my enemy say, "I have prevailed over him"; lest my foes rejoice because I am shaken. 5 But I have trusted in thy steadfast love; my heart shall rejoice in thy salvation. 6 I will sing to the LORD, because he has dealt bountifully with me.

Rev. 6:9 When he opened the fifth seal, I saw under the altar the souls of those who had been slain for the word of God and for the witness they had borne; 10 they cried out with a loud voice, "O Sovereign Lord, holy and true, how long before thou wilt judge and avenge our blood on those who dwell upon the earth?"

Rom. 12:19 Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord."

Jer. 51:59 The word which Jeremiah the prophet commanded Seraiah the son of Neriah, son of Mahseiah, when he went with Zedekiah king of Judah to Babylon, in the fourth year of his reign. Seraiah was the quartermaster. 60 Jeremiah wrote in a book all the evil that should come upon Babylon, all these words that are written concerning Babylon. 61 And Jeremiah said to Seraiah: "When you come to Babylon, see that you read all these words, 62 and say, 'O LORD, thou hast said concerning this place that thou wilt cut it off, so that nothing shall dwell in it, neither man nor beast, and it shall be desolate for ever.' 63 When you finish reading this book, bind a stone to it, and cast it into the midst of the Euphrates, 64 and say, 'Thus shall Babylon sink, to rise no more, because of the evil that I am bringing upon her.'"

Thus far are the words of Jeremiah.

Rev. 19:1 After this I heard what seemed to be the loud voice of a great multitude in heaven, crying, "Hallelujah! Salvation and glory and power belong to our God, 2 for his judgments are true and just; he has judged the great harlot who corrupted the earth with her fornication, and he has avenged on her the blood of his servants." 3 Once more they cried, "Hallelujah! The smoke from her goes up for ever and ever." 4 And the twenty-four elders and the four living creatures fell down and worshiped God who is seated on the throne, saying, "Amen. Hallelujah!" 5 And from the throne came a voice crying, "Praise our God, all you his servants, you who fear him, small and great." 6 Then I heard what seemed to be the voice of a great multitude, like the sound of many waters and like the sound of mighty thunderpeals, crying, "Hallelujah! For the Lord our God the Almighty reigns.
