:00 Reviewing comments as to chapters 17 and 18 and the downfall of the structures of the evil one. Further there is a teaching on the contemporary time of John as he wrote the book.

6:20 John 17:4 A reference to the fact that Jesus had completed everything the Father had asked him to do.

6:45 Revelation 19. A reading. Teaching that in chapters 17 and 18 the view of the events was primarily from an earthly perspective. In chapter 19 the view shifts to one more like a heavenly perspective.

11:45 Revelation 17. A look at the contrasting Trinities: The Holy Trinity of God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The evil false trinity - Satan, The Beast and the False Prophet. Additionally we have the image of Two women – The Bride of Christ and the Whore of Babylon. Also the image of two cities – Babylon, the world opposed to God, and the new Jerusalem, the symbol of God's family.

14:40 Revelation 19 – verse 1ff. Teaching, including the nature of God's judgment, as described in Genesis 18:25.

21:05 Psalm 13 How long will evil go unpunished Lord ? An example of the Psalms reflecting the perennial feelings of God's people. Complaint and then rejoicing.

23:50 Revelation 6:9-10 How long?

24:40 Romans 12:19 Do not take revenge, that is the Lord's province.

25:45 Back to Revelation 19:2ff The Lord has avenged on the great prostitute the blood of his servants. Also 18:20 Rejoice, for God has judged her for the way she has treated you. Teaching continues.

28:45 The four living creatures and the Cherubim - Isaiah 6:1-4; Ezekiel 1:4-28; Exodus 25:10-22. Revelation 19:4 – Amen, Hallelijah as in Psalm 106:48.

Revelation 19:5. What is Praise to God ? See Revelation 1:17 – a sense of absolute worship, then a blending of Joy and delight.

36:40 Revelation 19:6-8 Teaching. God betrothed himself to his people as in a husband and wife relationship. Ezekiel 16:8; Hosea 2:16-20; Jeremiah 31:31-32. In the New Testament, God's people – the church, is the Bride of Christ.

39:45 Ephesians 5:32 The profound mystery of marriage – God and his people and husband and wife. Christ is the Head of the Church (verse 23), The church is subject to Christ (verse 24), Christ gave himself up for the church to make her holy that

she might be without blemish, holy and blameless (verses 25-27).

41:05 2 Corinthians 11:2 Paul says I promised you to one husband, to Christ. Teaching Revelation 19:7 where Christ is joined to his bride – The wedding of the Lamb. Reference to Matthew 26:29 (marriage supper of the lamb).

43:00 Teaching on the Holy Communion. Three aspects – **1**. Past – Remember; **2**. Present – Jesus said to eat his body and drink his blood, a symbolic way of saying that we should draw our nourishment and sustenance from him every day. **3**. Future – a look forward to that time when the Lord will once again break bread and drink wine with us, his bride, at the marriage supper of the Lamb.

44:00 Revelation 19:9-10 The power of the presence of God is so strong as to cause one to fall prostrate before him, but (verse 10) we must not confuse the messenger with the true God. At one point the people of Lystra and Derbe wanted to worship Paul and Barnabas Acts 14:11-15. They also attempted to worship Peter – Acts 10:23-26.

47:00 Revelation 19:10 The testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy. Teaching on prophecy – Jeremiah 23:21-22. Reference to 1 John 4:1-3 True testimony and prophecy is based on where one stands in reference to Jesus.

50:30 Revelation 19:11-13 His robe is dipped in blood. Reference explored – Revelation 16:12-21. Jesus is already the # 07-139-56 Cont'd

victor – at the cross. No battle necessary. It is finished. It is done! God just announces the end to all those opposed to him.

55:50 Revelation 19:17-18 The description of the other feast – not the feast of the marriage of the Lamb. You will either be a guest at the marriage supper or you will be part of the menu at the other feast.

56:45 Revelation 19:19-21 A description of the last of the Beast and the False Prophet (Looked at from God's perspective). In chapter 16:12-21 there is another picture from the view of Satan on earth. Again as seen in verse 19 – there is no battle, for there is no need of establishing a winner – that battle and victory was won at the crucifixion and resurrection.

57:10 An important teaching on a spiritual law about deception !

59:25 Ephesians 6:13-18 The sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

How long shall my enemy be exalted over me? <u>3</u> Consider and answer me, O LORD my God; lighten my eyes, lest I sleep the sleep of death; <u>4</u> lest my enemy say, "I have prevailed over him"; lest my foes rejoice because I am shaken. <u>5</u> But I have trusted in thy steadfast love; my heart shall rejoice in thy salvation. <u>6</u> I will sing to the LORD, because he has dealt bountifully with me.

<u>Is. 6:1</u> In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and his train filled the temple. <u>2</u> Above him stood the seraphim; each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. <u>3</u> And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory." <u>4</u> And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke.

Ezek. 1:4 As I looked, behold, a stormy wind came out of the north, and a great cloud, with brightness round about it, and fire flashing forth continually, and in the midst of the fire, as it were gleaming bronze. 5 And from the midst of it came the likeness of four living creatures. And this was their appearance: they had the form of men, 6 but each had four faces, and each of them had four wings. 7 Their legs were straight, and the soles of their feet were like the sole of a calf's foot; and they sparkled like burnished bronze. 8 Under their wings on their four sides they had human hands. And the four had their faces and their wings thus: 9 their wings touched one another; they went every one straight forward, without turning as they went. 10 As for the likeness of their faces, each had the face of a man in front; the four had the face of a lion on the right side, the four had the face of an ox on the left side, and the four had the face of an eagle at the back. 11 Such were their faces. And their wings were spread out above; each creature had two wings, each of which touched the wing of another, while two covered their bodies. 12 And each went straight forward; wherever the spirit would go, they went, without turning as they went. 13 In the midst of the living creatures there was something that looked like burning coals of fire, like torches moving to and fro among the living creatures; and the fire was bright, and out of the fire went forth lightning. 14 And the living creatures darted to and fro, like a flash of lightning.

<u>Ezek. 1:15</u> Now as I looked at the living creatures, I saw a wheel upon the earth beside the living creatures, one for each of the four of them. <u>16</u> As for the appearance of the wheels and their construction: their appearance was like the gleaming of a chrysolite; and the four had the same likeness, their construction being as it were a wheel within a wheel. <u>17</u> When they went, they went in any of their four directions without turning as they went. <u>18</u> The four wheels had rims and they had spokes; and their rims were full of eyes round about. <u>19</u> And when the living creatures went, the wheels went beside them; and when the living creatures rose from the earth, the wheels rose. 20

Wherever the spirit would go, they went, and the wheels rose along with them; for the spirit of the living creatures was in the wheels. <u>21</u> When those went, these went; and when those stood, these stood; and when those rose from the earth, the wheels rose along with them; for the spirit of the living creatures was in the wheels.

<u>Ezek. 1:22</u> Over the heads of the living creatures there was the likeness of a firmament, shining like crystal, spread out above their heads. <u>23</u> And under the firmament their wings were stretched out straight, one toward another; and each creature had two wings covering its body. <u>24</u> And when they went, I heard the sound of their wings like the sound of many waters, like the thunder of the Almighty, a sound of tumult like the sound of a host; when they stood still, they let down their wings. <u>25</u> And there came a voice from above the firmament over their heads; when they stood still, they let down their wings.

<u>Ezek. 1:26</u> And above the firmament over their heads there was the likeness of a throne, in appearance like sapphire; and seated above the likeness of a throne was a likeness as it were of a human form. <u>27</u> And upward from what had the appearance of his loins I saw as it were gleaming bronze, like the appearance of fire enclosed round about; and downward from what had the appearance of his loins I saw as it were the appearance of fire, and there was brightness round about him. <u>28</u> Like the appearance of the bow that is in the cloud on the day of rain, so was the appearance of the brightness round about.

Such was the appearance of the likeness of the glory of the LORD. And when I saw it, I fell upon my face, and I heard the voice of one speaking.

<u>Ex. 25:10</u> "They shall make an ark of acacia wood; two cubits and a half shall be its length, a cubit and a half its breadth, and a cubit and a half its height. <u>11</u> And you shall overlay it with pure gold, within and without shall you overlay it, and you shall make upon it a molding of gold round about. <u>12</u> And you shall cast four rings of gold for it and put them on its four feet, two rings on the one side of it, and two rings on the other side of it. <u>13</u> You shall make poles of acacia wood, and overlay them with gold. <u>14</u> And you shall put the poles into the rings on the sides of the ark, to carry the ark by them. <u>15</u> The poles shall remain in the rings of the ark; they shall not be taken from it. <u>16</u> And you shall put into the ark the testimony which I shall give you. <u>17</u> Then you shall make a mercy seat of pure gold; two cubits and a half shall be its length, and a cubit and a half its breadth. <u>18</u> And you shall make two cherubim of gold; of hammered work shall you make them, on the two ends of the mercy seat. <u>19</u> Make one cherub on the one end, and one cherub on the other end; of one piece with the mercy seat shall you make the cherubim on its two ends. <u>20</u> The cherubim shall spread out their wings above, overshadowing the mercy seat with their wings, their faces one to another; toward the mercy seat shall the faces of the cherubim be. <u>21</u> And you shall put the mercy seat on the top of the ark; and in the ark you shall put the testimony that I shall give you. <u>22</u> There I will meet with you, and from above the mercy seat, from between the two cherubim that are upon the ark of the testimony, I will speak with you of all that I will give you in commandment for the people of Israel.

<u>Acts 14:11</u> And when the crowds saw what Paul had done, they lifted up their voices, saying in Lycaonian, "The gods have come down to us in the likeness of men!" <u>12</u> Barnabas they called Zeus, and Paul, because he was the chief speaker, they called Hermes. <u>13</u> And the priest of Zeus, whose temple was in front of the city, brought oxen and garlands to the gates and wanted to offer sacrifice with the people. <u>14</u> But when the apostles Barnabas and Paul heard of it, they tore their garments and rushed out among the multitude, crying, <u>15</u> "Men, why are you doing this? We also are men, of like nature with you, and

bring you good news, that you should turn from these vain things to a living God who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and all that is in them.

Acts 10:23 So he called them in to be his guests.

The next day he rose and went off with them, and some of the brethren from Joppa accompanied him. <u>24</u> And on the following day they entered Caesarea. Cornelius was expecting them and had called together his kinsmen and close friends. <u>25</u> When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and fell down at his feet and worshiped him. <u>26</u> But Peter lifted him up, saying, "Stand up; I too am a man."

Jer. 23:21 "I did not send the prophets, yet they ran; I did not speak to them, yet they prophesied. 22 But if they had stood in my council, then they would have proclaimed my words to my people, and they would have turned them from their evil way, and from the evil of their doings.

<u>1John 4:1</u> Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are of God; for many false prophets have gone out into the world. <u>2</u> By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit which confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is of God, <u>3</u> and every spirit which does not confess Jesus is not of God. This is the spirit of antichrist, of which you heard that it was coming, and now it is in the world already.

<u>Rev. 19:11</u> Then I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse! He who sat upon it is called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he judges and makes war. <u>12</u> His eyes are like a flame of fire, and on his head are many diadems; and he has a name inscribed which no one knows but himself. <u>13</u> He is clad in a robe dipped in blood, and the name by which he is called is The Word of God.

<u>Rev. 16:12</u> The sixth angel poured his bowl on the great river Euphrates, and its water was dried up, to prepare the way for the kings from the east. <u>13</u> And I saw, issuing from the mouth of the dragon and from the mouth of the beast and from the mouth of the false prophet, three foul spirits like frogs; <u>14</u> for they are demonic spirits, performing signs, who go abroad to the kings of the whole world, to assemble them for battle on the great day of God the Almighty. <u>15</u> ("Lo, I am coming like a thief! Blessed is he who is awake, keeping his garments that he may not go naked and be seen exposed!") <u>16</u> And they assembled them at the place which is called in Hebrew Armageddon.

<u>Rev. 16:17</u> The seventh angel poured his bowl into the air, and a loud voice came out of the temple, from the throne, saying, "It is done!" <u>18</u> And there were flashes of lightning, voices, peals of thunder, and a great earthquake such as had never been since men were on the earth, so great was that earthquake. <u>19</u> The great city was split into three parts, and the cities of the nations fell, and God remembered great Babylon, to make her drain the cup of the fury of his wrath. <u>20</u> And every island fled away, and no mountains were to be found; <u>21</u> and great hailstones, heavy as a hundred-weight, dropped on men from heaven, till men cursed God for the plague of the hail, so fearful was that plague.

To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints,
