07-153-56 THE NEW JERUSALEM

- :00 5:00 Reading of the 21st chapter.
- 5:00 7:20 Commentary as to how one should take in the symbolic nature of the book.
 - 7:20 Chapter 21 teaching begins. Mostly on verses 1-4.
- 8:20 2 Peter 3:3-13 A description of some of the behavior and activity leading to the Day of the Lord. God is giving an extended opportunity for more to come to him. (Verse 13) After the destruction will come a new heaven and a new earth, the home of righteousness. This ties into the opening of Revelation 21:1-5. Teaching on what "new" implies.
- 14:45 Hebrews 11:8-10 Abraham lived as if he were a stranger in the land, passing through, as he awaited God's ultimate city.
- 18:00 2 Chronicles 6:18 God is not in buildings built by man. 1 Corinthians 3:16-17 and 6:19 God's people are his temple for his Spirit is in them. These all tie in to Revelation 21:3.
- 22:45 Revelation 21:5-6 (Verse 6 Thirsty). Teaching about God's living water and its function in our life.

24:15 Isaiah 55:1 Come all who are thirsty. Psalm 42:1-2 My soul thirsts for God. John 4:13-14, Everyone who drinks of the water that Jesus gives will never thirst and out of him will flow springs welling up to eternal life. John 7:37-39 the water Jesus gives is the Holy Spirit. We were made to run on God – not on the things we normally assume.

27:45 Revelation 21:7-8 Nothing of man's sin will pass into the eternal kingdom.

28:50 Revelation 21:9- 27 The bride is the "New Jerusalem" (the people of God). Also the twelve tribes and the twelve apostles stand for the people of God.

Verse 16 - God's city is a perfect cube, which has always represented his dwelling place – the Holy of Holies was a perfect cube.

Verse 19 - Transparent gold.

Verse 22 – No Temple.

Verse 23 - No need of any external light for God himself is the light.

Verses 24-26 - The beauty which can be redeemed will be.

Verse 27 - Nothing impure will enter.

Rev. 21:15 And he who talked to me had a measuring rod of gold to measure the city and its gates and walls. 16 The city lies foursquare, its length the same as its breadth; and he measured the city with his rod, twelve thousand stadia; its length and breadth and height are equal. 17 He also measured its wall, a hundred and forty-four cubits by a man's measure, that is, an angels. 18 The wall was built of jasper, while the city was pure gold, clear as glass. 19

The foundations of the wall of the city were adorned with every jewel; the first was jasper, the second sapphire, the third agate, the fourth emerald, <u>20</u> the fifth onyx, the sixth carnelian, the seventh chrysolite, the eighth beryl, the ninth topaz, the tenth chrysoprase, the eleventh jacinth, the twelfth amethyst. <u>21</u> And the twelve gates were twelve pearls, each of the gates made of a single pearl, and the street of the city was pure gold, transparent as glass.

Rev. 21:22 And I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. 23 And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine upon it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. 24 By its light shall the nations walk; and the kings of the earth shall bring their glory into it, 25 and its gates shall never be shut by day — and there shall be no night there; 26 they shall bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. 27 But nothing unclean shall enter it, nor any one who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

<u>2Pet. 3:3</u> First of all you must understand this, that scoffers will come in the last days with scoffing, following their own passions <u>4</u> and saying, "Where is the promise of his coming? For ever since the fathers fell asleep, all things have continued as they were from the beginning of creation." <u>5</u> They deliberately ignore this fact, that by the word of God heavens existed long ago, and an earth formed out of water and by means of water, <u>6</u> through which the world that then existed was deluged with water and perished. <u>7</u> But by the same word the heavens and earth that now exist have been stored up for fire, being kept until the day of judgment and destruction of ungodly men.

<u>2Pet. 3:8</u> But do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day. <u>9</u> The Lord is not slow about his promise as some count slowness, but is forbearing toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. <u>10</u> But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and the works that are upon it will be burned up.

<u>2Pet. 3:11</u> Since all these things are thus to be dissolved, what sort of persons ought you to be in lives of holiness and godliness, <u>12</u> waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be kindled and dissolved, and the elements will melt with fire! 13 But according

to his promise we wait for new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells.
